The Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust:

How It Began

The Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust was formed by old students of the Aligarh Muslim University and like-minded people in February 1961 with the aim of carrying forward Sir Syed Ahmed Khan's mission of education. The core group worked diligently and over the years more people joined in either to finance the projects or to offer their services to this noble cause. Their efforts were rewarded by the establishment of the first Aligarh Public School, Gulberg, Lahore in September 1965. The next year saw the inauguration of the Aligarh Public School, Manga which is a boarding school located in a rural area close to Lahore. Today the Aligarh Public Schools are proudly imparting affordable, quality education to almost 2000 boys and girls and teaching them to become better citizens as well as educated human beings. The Sir Syed College of Computer Science, affiliated with the University of Engineering and Technology, Lahore was added to the Gulberg Campus in 2014.

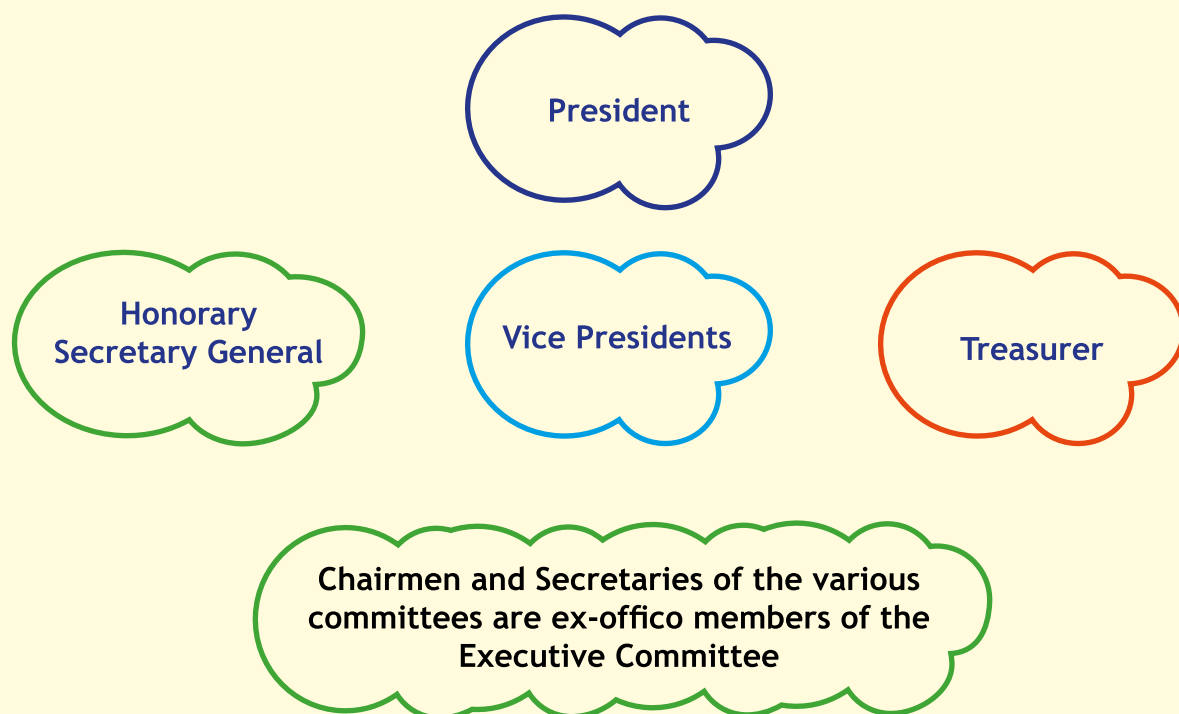
The aim of the Trust is to operate sustainable projects. The modus operandi is therefore to seek financial contribution for capital expenditure, i.e. buildings are constructed with the generous donations of philanthropists. The education institution charges moderate fee which covers all recurring expenditure. Lack of resources is not an impediment to admission. Scholarships are awarded generously to deserving students.

We seek to expand and improve our services. Our future projects include establishment of a Higher Secondary School for Girls in DHA, Lahore on donated land, a University at Manga and residential blocks for teachers and employees at Manga. All members of the Trust work as volunteers with an ardent desire to serve. No emoluments of any kind are taken and no facilities are offered.

The office bearers and members of the Executive Committee are all voluntary members and elected by the General Body in the Annual General Meeting for a period of 3 years.

The Executive Committee: Who Are They?

Mr. G.A. Sabri, President, is a Chemical Engineer and retired as Federal Secretary Petroleum and Natural Resources, Government of Pakistan after a distinguished service of almost 35 years. He has a rich experience of management, project execution and administration. During his service he remained member on the Board of Directors of 18 major companies/organizations. In 1999 he was appointed Vice President after the demise of his father Mr. G.M. Sabri, who was the Honorary Secretary General at that time. Mr. G.A.Sabri was later elected President in 2012. He also heads the Appointment Board of TAT.

Mr. Wasif A. Siddiqui, Honorary Secretary General, an Alig, is a Geological Engineer and has over 50 years' experience in Rock Engineering. He has worked in Iran, Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, Malaysia and Pakistan. He was also Adviser to UN. Presently he works as an Adviser to MM Pakistan (Pvt) Limited. He was Secretary Education Board from 1995 to 1999. He has been serving as Honorary Secretary General since 1999.

Mr. T.M Sheikh, Vice President, is a B.Sc Civil Engineer F/E, F., ASCE (USA) M/E CPE (AUST) and is Chairman of Interhom (Pvt) Ltd. He has been associated with the Trust since 1989 and has been a generous donor at all times.

Mr. Sultan Hameed, Vice President, is a retired Federal Secretary Government of Pakistan and a former District Nazim, Jhang. He brings a vast experience of administration.

Mr. Aslam Mughal, Vice President, is a former CEO Punjab Land Development Company, former Adviser UN, former Chief Metropolitan Planner and Director General LDA. He has been serving the Trust in this capacity for the last 18 years. He heads the Construction Committee of the Trust and is the Chairman of the Governing Body of Sir Syed College of Computer Science (SCOCS).

Mr. Zia Haider Rizvi, Chairman Education Board, is a distinguished Consul of the Supreme Court of Pakistan and was twice Care Taker Minister of Excise & Taxation Punjab. He is also ex Consul General of Thailand in Pakistan. He was twice elected President of the Lahore Tax Bar Association. He has been associated with the Trust for the last 15 years.

Mr. Nazeer Adhami, Member, an Alig, is a former Vice President NESPAK and Member Executive Committee Senior Citizen Foundation DHA Lahore Chapter. He has also served as Secretary Education Board for 16 years.

Mr. Nazeer Chaudhry, Member, is a Civil Engineer with over 50 years of experience, both at national and international level. He has worked in WAPDA, Iran, Saudi Arabia and

UNDP. He is a member of the Construction Committee.

Ms. Sabra Khatoon, Member, is a graduate of the College of Home Economics, Lahore. She had been associated with TAT since a long time before becoming a Member.

Dr. Syed Masood Sabri, Member, brings over 18 years of experience in the field of medicine.

Mr. Aftab Ahmad Rizvi, Member, an Alig, worked as Director Finance WAPDA and brings a rich experience of finance which he utilises for the benefit of TAT as member Finance Committee. He has been associated with TAT since 1989.

The Aligarh Public School & College, Gulberg

The Aligarh Public School for Girls was established in 1965 in a rented building. After moving into its present premises in 1981, the school continued to grow. It now has a preschool, primary school for boys and girls, a campus for girls' middle and high school, a boys' middle and high school and a higher secondary school for girls. It is affiliated with the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Lahore. It also had the distinction of being ranked amongst the top ten institutions of Lahore at the time of the last survey held in 2014. At present it has about 900 students and 56 teachers.

As the Trust's objective is to make education accessible to as many as possible, 269 students of the Gulberg Campus were recipients of the Need-based Scholarship scheme, including students financed through zakat.

Sprawling over an area of 51 acres, the Aligarh Public School and College, Manga is set in the outskirts of Lahore. Its green lawns, huge playing fields invite the students to enjoy school life to the fullest extent: academics, sports, serene environment and the camaraderie of hostel life. It has over 900 students, out of which over 200 are boarders. The Girls' section has 254 students. 112 students benefitted from the Need-based Scholarship Scheme. There are 46 teachers, many of whom live on the premises.

The school consists of 4 academic buildings, one each for pre-school, primary, girls and boys. At present there are five hostels for students apart from residences for teachers and staff members. The Principal has a separate bungalow.

The Manga Campus also has an Irshad Ali Shah IT Centre which was funded by Mr Imran Shah in memory of his father. This has given students the possibility to remain up to date with technology as well. We are happy to mention that Mrs Imran Shah is an old student of Aligarh Public School and College, Gulberg.

Manga, 40 kilometres away from Lahore, was once considered far but now with the extension of the city it has come very close to the new housing societies such as EME and Bahria Town. It is only at a driving distance of 45 minutes from Gulberg.

This year saw the inauguration of the fifth hostel: T.M.Sheikh Hostel that can accommodate 64 students. This hostel was constructed with the generous donation of Mr T.M.Sheikh, Vice-President of the Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust.

The APSC Manga is also registered with the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education Lahore.

Teacher Training

Sir Syed College of Computer Science is the latest venture of the Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust. It was established in 2014 and the first batch of students will graduate in 2018. At present it is imparting education to 47 students, both boys and girls. The College is offering the regular 4 years undergraduate programme with the affiliation of the University of Engineering and Technology, Lahore. The College is housed in the Gulberg Campus at present. The size permits the faculty members to give full attention to every student. Scholarships are given generously; more than 75% students are receiving full or partial scholarships.

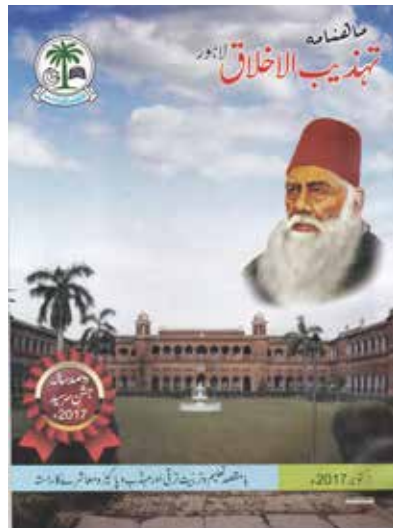
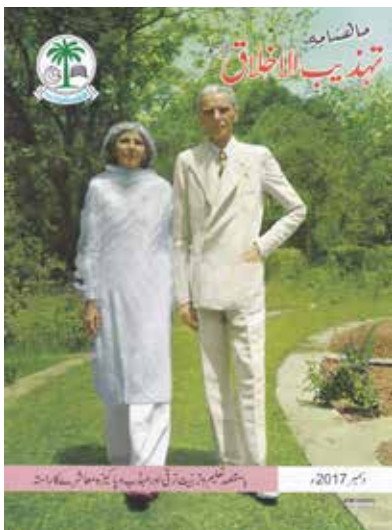

“TEHZIBUL AKHLAQ” The Monthly Magazine

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan visited Europe to observe their educational system with the objective of ameliorating the socio economic conditions of Muslims of the Sub-Continent through education. During his visit he was deeply impressed by the articles published in certain well known journals. Realizing that the written word could help convey the message of social change he envisioned for the Sub-Continent, he decided to bring out a journal for the welfare and social development of the Muslims. This journal was named “Tehzibul Akhlaq” which was instrumental in the establishment of the Mohammedan Anglo Oriental College in 1875, the College that became the Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) in 1920.

This was the name the newly formed society of Aligarh Old boys and friends decided to adopt for their Trust in September 1961. Following in the footsteps of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan, they also decided to launch a monthly magazine with the same historic name of “Tehzibul Akhlaq”. Accordingly its publication began in 1961 and has continued till today. The magazine appears monthly. With an editorial board of its own, it is a blend of articles that keep the spirit of Aligarh and Sir Syed alive and address current social and moral issues.



Dreams, Projects and Plans

We are an organisation that aims for growth at all levels. We want to expand our sphere and reach out to many more young people; we would like to improve the services we provide; we dream of taking our Trust to new pinnacles!

Let us share some of our plans, projects and our great dream.

New building for the Primary School at Manga

Since many years Manga Campus has felt the need for a separate building for its Primary Section which was estimated at more than 10 million rupees. As we go into print we have been offered a generous donation for the construction of a new building for the primary school. Our donor would like to dedicate it to his mother's memory. More details in our next year's report (In Sha Allah).

Aligarh Public School: Qutub Shah Campus, Lahore

In 2003, one of well-wishers of the Trust, Syed Agha Qutubuddin Shah, donated 13 kanals of land for the construction of a school named after him. This land is located at Bhatta Chowk, on Main Defence Road, Lahore. Unfortunately he died soon after and the plot was taken over by the land mafia with the connivance of some of his relatives. We finally took possession of the land in 2015 and are now in the final phase of litigation. As soon as we gain complete possession, we would like to start construction over there. The estimated cost of the building is Rs 30 million. We invite philanthropists to share in educating the youth.

Renovations, construction and transport at Manga

Three of the hostels at Manga are in dire need of renovation as they were constructed in the sixties. The estimated cost is Rs. 3 million each and we shall put an inscription of the donor's name.

Additional residential quarters for the staff are a pressing need. This building is expected to cost Rs 10 million.

The Manga Campus also requires an ambulance and at least two buses for the students.

Our Grand Dream

The Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust has already ventured in the field of higher education with the Sir Syed College of Computer Science. Another institution Sir Syed College of Management Sciences is planned to commence this year. We would like to soar higher and build a Naya Aligarh University at Manga where we have ample land for this purpose. We are planning to commence construction of the first academic block in 2018. Some commitments have already been made but a project of this magnitude of 60,000 sq.ft., costing approximately Rs 300 million will draw upon the generosity of many more. We invite you to share in this endeavour and get your name inscribed over the building/room. The proposed cost sharing is as under:
