

It is a privilege for me to present this year's report to you. This has been a hectic year indeed as construction started on our New Aligarh University Project's building in Manga. By the Grace of Allah SWT work is being carried out at a remarkable speed as you will witness when you read the relevant report. The Construction Committee has been very active indeed! Fortunately, since the Manga Campus is spread over 51 acres, construction work does not pose any hazard to the students as the site is quite apart from the school buildings.

I would like to reiterate the Trust's underlying Vision and Theme: "To Create National Harmony". Our aim is to attract students from under privileged areas of the country, assist them enter our educational institutions through our Tehzibul Akhlaq Outreach Program (TOP), nurture them in a clean and healthy environment thus help them become patriotic, open-minded Pakistanis who are above regional and ethnic prejudices. This year we received 80 new students from Waziristan under our TOP scheme. We are expanding our hostel and school facilities to be able to accommodate the new students from next academic year. At present we have 167 students from Balochistan, 91 from Waziristan, 57 from Punjab, 16 from Sindh, 10 from Gilgit Baltistan, 5 from KPK and 2 from AJK in our Manga Campus, out of which 224 are TOP scholars. Learning together, playing together and sharing beautiful moments of student life will, we hope, create a bond for life.

Alhamdulillah work in schools is going smoothly. Both academic and co-curricular activities have been in full swing. As our goal is to help children develop into good, confident human beings, patriotic citizens as well as academically strong students. We lay a great deal of emphasis on activities that will help them become confident and creative. Our environment club is very active too.

Where this year we have had the pleasure of welcoming several new members in our Trust, we have also lost an eminent member, Mr. Zia Haider Rizvi. He served for 22 dedicated years. May Allah SWT bless him and rest his soul in Jannah. Ameen.

All capital expenditure i.e. construction cost is met through donations. The sincerity of purpose, dedication, and trustworthiness of our pioneers has been able to convince philanthropists to donate to our cause and by the Grace of Allah, this continues to be the case even today.

The Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust aims to equip the youth with modern knowledge and instill the values of our religion and culture in them. 
The schools offer coeducation till primary level, then boys and girls are assigned to different sections so that they can be allowed to grow in environments conducive to their respective natures.



Hostels A Home Away from Home

Our Manga campus is home to 348 boys. Having boarders is both a privilege and responsibility. Where a school is limited by timings in providing access to things like sports, health, leisure time and camaraderie, hostels unlock this – even if they come with many more safeguards to implement.

The continuation of religious practices and inter-cultural harmony remains a focus for our wardens. Boys from different backgrounds, provinces and cultures need to unite in their identity as Pakistanis and Aligarians. Regional prejudices are put on the side, and after living together in such a diverse environment, our boarders go on to the wider world with an understanding that few at that age have.

The boys live in five houses, each supervised by a House Master and Assistant House Masters. Meals bring everyone together under the roof of the Ayesha Sabri Dining Hall, which can seat up to 300 diners. Students are also given access to evening classes, with remedial classes being available for students struggling with a particular subject. Of course, with hundreds of boys together, Manga has realized the potential for sports and created ample access to healthy competitive outputs. Swimming and field sports are all available at the hostel itself. Both the sports and remedial classes are accessible to day scholars as well who wish to participate.

Leisure isn't reserved in sports though, as Saturdays hold movie nights for those who want to attend, while other leisure activities like gardening give students a place to learn and be put at ease.

In the same way competition isn't limited to leisure either. Each house competes to see who can earn awards and trophies, be it sports, character building, studies or more – each comes with its own legacy that students try to be a part of.

Great attention is given to the character formation of the students in order to encourage team spirit and peer to peer learning. The following trophies are awarded to the House for the overall performance of the boarders:

1. Academic Trophy for the overall best school results
2. Character building trophy to the best-behaved house and one that excelled in extra-curricular activities
3. House Keeping Trophy for the house that remained neatest during the year
4. Sports Trophy to the winner of matches and sports competitions
5. Quaid-e-Azam Trophy for the House that excelled in all areas

The hostels are the crown jewels of our schooling system. We're so proud of what we've created, be it house legacy, battling prejudice or creating spaces where children can truly put their best foot forward in a competitive environment. The Manga campus is the realisation of a vision of grooming, education and boyhood dreams come true.

The Environment Club is very active at APS Manga. The children are fully involved in plantation and caring for the saplings. The school has planted more than 1300 trees. The school also has a special offer of Sadiqa-e-Jaria: "Plant a Tree for your loved ones". You plant the tree and we will look after it over the years. The tree will bear the name you give.

Tehzibul Akhlaq Outreach Program (TOP)

The vision of the Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust is to take education and knowledge out to as many young people as possible. This vision led to the opening of the Manga Campus, at that time an underdeveloped rural area of the outskirts on Lahore. The school imparted quality education at par with good urban educational institutions of big cities. The school also established a branch for girls as we firmly believe in ending gender disparity as the country cannot progress if girls lag behind in education.

Seeking to broaden our influence, we have initiated the Tehzibul Akhlaq Outreach Program in 2020 which aims to bring boys of far- flung areas of Pakistan in its sphere of learning. With the help of the corporate sector and generous donors we announce scholarships in newspapers for areas which lack good educational facilities. Boys desirous of competing have to take a test organised by the National Testing Service. Successful candidates are interviewed by a team of school faculty in their home towns. The fortunate ones are offered a seat in the hostels. All tuition and boarding expenses are borne by the sponsors, till successful completion of their studies.

The scheme has proved to be very successful. A glance at the table will show the number and areas of the TOP scholars. The modest start of 38 TOP scholarships has now Masha Allah reached 224. On the social and academic scale, the students mingle very quickly with their classmates and are soon taking part in studies, sports and co-curricular activities. Some of them have made remarkable progress. Spending formative years together in the boarding erases prejudices and forms lasting friendships on a national scale.

We request sponsorship for new entrants starting April 2024. As mentioned above the sponsors has to commit till the completion of the Higher Secondary School examination. There are two ways to sponsor a student:

- Either on annual basis, OR
- Make a life time payment of Rs 3.5 million for each boarding student. These proceeds will be placed in the Endowment Fund and invested for safe returns. The yield of this investment will cater for the yearly fee of the student. Upon completion of his studies, this will be automatically rolled over for next intakes and hence a life time cycle for the Trust, perpetually in the name of the donor.

New Aligarh University (NAU)

The Dream moving towards Reality






When the pioneers of Tehzibul Akhlaq Trust joined hands to spread education in the country, their ultimate aim was to establish an educational institution that would create the same patriotism and spirit of Muslim brotherhood as their alma mater. They wanted youngsters to rise above ethnic, linguistic and racial prejudices, come together as one nation and strive to serve their country. The Trust has been working slowly but steadily towards this goal and finally, with the assistance of our generous donors, an edifice is taking shape. In the present circumstances where the name of Aligarh has been changed to Harigarh, it is vital to keep the spirit of the Pakistan movement alive and vibrant in the youth. Furthermore, what could be a better location than the city where the Pakistan Resolution was passed!

Accordingly, the Master Plan for the NAU Campus was formed at Manga. The primary question was the financing of such an immense project, hence sources of funding etc. were worked out. On 26.2.2020 the first application was submitted to Lahore Development Authority (LDA), as Manga falls within this jurisdiction. In the first phase the plan was to construct the ground plus five floors building, each of 20,000 square feet as well as a Multi Purpose Hall having a covered area of 25,000 sq feet with a seating capacity of 450 people. After fulfilling other requirements, initial approval of Structural Drawings of the Project was given by LDA on 17th August 2021, conditional upon obtaining other No Objections Certificates from WASA, TEPA, EPA etc.

After overcoming all bureaucratic hurdles in record time, public tenders were floated. Construction contract was awarded on 14th March 2022 to a leading firm of Lahore at an estimated cost of Rs 500 million, initially for ground plus first floor and the Multi Purpose Hall. The latter is being entirely funded by the family of one of the founders. Unfortunately, due to world wide economic crisis, this cost has now gone up to Rs 1000 million which is being raised through donations.

The ground breaking of the Project took place on 25th March 2022, by our senior most Trustee, late Mian Shamim Ahmad. We are pleased to report that the grey structure of NAU is Alhumdullillah complete and the work has moved into the finishing stage: the highest cost item. Your participation is therefore once again requested through the following financing plans. Remember this is also mode of honouring the memory of your near and dear ones as their names will be inscribed outside the rooms.




